But first we will read from:

Ephesians 4:4-7

There is one body, and one Spirit, even as ye are called in one hope of your calling;

5 One Lord, one faith, one baptism,

6 One God and Father of all, who is above all, and through all, and in you all.

7 But unto every one of us is given grace according to the (FULL) measure of the gift of Christ.

Ephesians 4 use terms as "oneness", "unity", "one body", "perfecting of the saints" etc.

v.3 Endeavouring to keep the unity of the Spirit

v.4 There is one body, and one Spirit, even as ye are called in one hope v.5 One Lord, one faith, one baptism,

v.6 One God and Father of all, who is above all, and through all, and in you all.

v.13 Till we all come in the unity of the faith v.25 ... we are members one of another.

Than Paul end the chapter with:

32 And **be ye kind one to another**, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, even as God for Christ's sake hath forgiven you.

The Key to Unity and Power

In the message of Jesus, there is always a profound emphasis on being one with Him and the Father.

The KEY for us (The church of Jesus) to be one/ in unity

John 17:21 KJV

21 that they all may be one, as You, Father, are in Me, and I in You; that they also may be one in Us, that the world may believe that You sent Me.

In our new identity with Christ You are:

100% righteous & 100% HOLY & 100% One with the Jesus and the Father.

1 Corinthians 1:30 But of Him <mark>you are in Christ Jesus</mark>, who became for us wisdom from God - and righteousness and sanctification and redemption

This concept of oneness holds great significance for believers, as it not only brings unity but also **unlocks the power and grace available to us.**

Did God the Father answer the prayer of Jesus to be One in Him and the Father?

YES HE DID!

John 17:20-21

Matt 28:18-20

18 Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me.

19 Therefore go and <u>make disciples</u> of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit,

20 and teaching them to obey everything I have <u>commanded you</u>. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

Jesus commandment:

John 13:34-35

34 "A new command I give you: <u>Love one another. As I have loved</u> you, so you must love one another.

35 By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another."
